





State subsidies distorting trade; how to address them?

In December 2017, the European Union, the United States and Japan agreed to cooperate to promote a more level playing field globally for the businesses. They share a concern on unfair competition conditions caused by large market-distorting subsidies and cooperate in view of eliminating them.

A seminar held on Wednesday 27 March 2019 will throw light on the trilateral cooperation and on why information is important in the work for a more level playing field in the global markets. The seminar is organized by the Confederation of Finnish Industries (EK), the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment, and the Ministry for Foreign Affairs. The first part of the programme is held in English (until 10:30) and the rest in Finnish.
